




### **HEIFER DONATIONS NEARING \$2,500**

Our Impact the World board has had a very busy month of April preparing for the congregational rummage sale. Susan DeJong and I are excited to go to Vietnam to share the love of Christ with the people we meet as we visit the various communities. The money raised through the rummage sale will be used to help the people with current needs that we see as we travel across the country. The money will be given directly to Vital Links, a service organization that Bill Moberly's organization ALWM partners with, to meet these

immediate needs. By giving the money in this manner we can be assured that it will be properly used for the purpose intended. An example of this was when we were there in 2019. We were at a rural church and a lady kept point to the ceiling of the fellowship hall and pulling my husband, Steve, in that direction so he could see the problem. ### **PASTOR'S LETTER**

### PENTECOST-----What is it?

Pentecost Sunday will be celebrated this year on Sunday, May 19, marking the 50 days after Easter. Pentecost Sunday is a holiday marked each year in liturgical churches such as ours. It is the day when Christians around the world celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit which marks then, the birth of the Christian Church. We could rightly say, "Happy Birthday, Church," and be most accurate as it marks the day when Jesus' disciples began to share the story of Jesus and invite others to share their faith in their faith as the Son of God. So, Pentecost is much more than a historical event as we, too, continue the work of the disciples, sharing the story of Jesus in the world today and inviting others to join us in our faith.

At Christmas, Christians celebrate the incarnation---Christ became human in the form of a person. At Easter, we celebrate the Resurrection----our firm belief that Jesus rose from the dead; a sign of the promise of resurrection given to all God's people.

And, at Pentecost, we celebrate the Holy Spirit--the gift of God's comfort, power, and strength to God's people.

The liturgical color for the Sunday of Pentecost is red----thus, the paraments on the altar and pulpit change to red for that Sunday. The red color symbolizes the apostles "tongues of fire" and also the blood of the martyrs. Sometimes people will wear red clothing to worship on that day. (You are welcome to do that on May 19<sup>th</sup> if you would like.) Those red paraments don't appear again until Reformation Sunday at the end of October----used only on those two Sundays of the church year.

The small picture that appears with this article is of a plaque I received from my pastor and his wife when I left for college and I have treasured it for over 60 years holding an honored place in our home. It is a special reminder of the constant presence of the Holy Spirit in my life over all these years.

The Book of Acts speaks to the signs of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. In Acts 2:1-3 we hear these words, When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues, as of fire, appeared to them and rested on each one of them. We must also remember the dove as a symbol representing the Holy Spirit; and that the Holy Spirit descended "like a dove" and hovered over Jesus when he was baptized. The dove became the symbol of peace.

Just as the Holy Spirit turned the lives of the Apostles upside down, the Holy Spirit has a way of turning our lives upside down, too. As we learn more and more about the life of Jesus and as are called to share in the blessings that faith in him offers, the Holy Spirit becomes an active part of our faith and ministry. The Book of Acts is all about how the lives of the disciples got turned upside down and they, in turn, turned the world upside down in the name of Jesus.

As we approach Pentecost in 2024, may you find peace in knowing the Holy Spirit is with you as your comforter, guide, intercessor, and encourager. May the power of the Holy Spirit lead and guide you each day.
