In the event it appears Pastor Curtis is interested in joining our church family, we will need to have a congregational meeting to approve the call. Our church constitution states, "Notice of all meetings of this congregation shall be given at worship services for two consecutive Sundays preceding the scheduled meeting and also printed materials are made available to the membership at least 10 days in advance of the meeting." We are all anxious to secure a full-time pastor. Please keep in mind that these things can only happen relatively slowly. Keep your ears open in the



event we are going to have a congregational meeting to call Pastor Curtis. (This is the process used for hiring Pastor Groethe and when we attempted to call Pastor Cave.)

The building committee has been working with the architect for the possible addition to our church. This is a process that also takes time and is not something that we will all first notice when we come to the church premises and see new

> construction. This project is being done with a lot of desire to do the right thing. Once the architect has completed the initial planning, the building committee will further inform the congregation and we can decide if building is something we want to do. The addition does not come without cost. Initial estimate of the project is in the neighborhood of \$3,000,000.00.

It is proposed that the 6 windows in the sanctuary be adorned with stained glass. This is in an effort to make the sanctuary appear more like a church, in recognition of past

friends/relatives/congregation members and to keep us from looking out the windows during the sermon. The cost has been established at approximately \$1,350 per window. Should we decide to put in the windows, we need to have a plan as to what they will look like. Marty Buttke has agreed to head up a group to further pursue this goal. If interested, please contact Marty or if he contacts you, please consider assisting.

Please carefully consider the possible call of Pastor Simonson and the possible addition to our church building and pray that God guides us in the direction he wants us to go.

The meeting opened with prayer for God's guidance to use the resources He has given us to His glory and in service according to His will.

It was noted that Steven Strege has resigned from the ITW board. We thank him for his service on the board since 2019.

Treasurer's report by Marcia Heinje Noisy change update.

Updates for Kelly

Decisions made to give \$200 to Alpha Center. We will give Noisy change to Dynamic Disciples in August We will give Noisy Change to ALWM in September with a Mission Sunday on Sept 22 with Bill Moberly as guest speaker.

We will wait until September meeting on September 10 to decide on the Noisy Change designations for October and November

The needs of the various missions in Vietnam were defined as follows:

Mission needs in Vietnam and Cambodia

Help to build living quarters for a caretaker at the Soc Ung

IMPACT MISSIONS

Church (the one we built)

Help to build an education center in Cambodia with Pastor Sam Help meet the many needs at Dr. Hang's orphanage and school. Build filtration systems for the churches surrounding the Soc Ung Church and the churches near Khanh Vinh Province. Supply quilts for the beds in Dr. Hang's orphanage.

The following items were discussed concerning these needs in Vietnam and other matters.

1. VBS raised \$500 for water filtration projects and wells. We should be able to use this money for the various water project needs in Vietnam. We will need to talk to Laurie Maas concerning this matter.

2. Concerning the need for a house for a caretaker at our church in Vietnam, Ron suggested that walls be built around the filtration system to protect it and a spigot be used for obtaining the water. Ron was given contact info for Pastor Bill to gain more insight into the situation.

3. It was noted that we can rest assured that our money is being used correctly in Vietnam as Pastor Bill gets and gives information to Van, the project manager for Vital Links, the organization that partners with ALWM to serve the needs of people and mission in Vietnam. From what we have seen it appears that everything is done correctly and in order.

4. Pastor Bill will be our preacher for our mission festival service on September 22. Marcia made a motion that was seconded by Linda that special offerings that day should go to Pastor Bill to be used for the mission needs that we designate. Motion passed.

5. Sue made a motion that was seconded by Vicki to make ALWM in Vietnam and Cambodia the September Noisy Change recipient. Motion passed.

6. A motion was made by Sue and seconded by Gloria to give \$200 to the Alpha Center in place of making them a Noisy Change recipient. Motion passed.

7. On Sept 21 we will have a supper for Pastor Bill and Sally so we can visit in greater details about the projects we are considering in Vietnam and Cambodia.

8. October, November, and December Noisy Change will be left open so as to respond to immediate needs that arise.
9. Our mission board has also been told by a reliable source that Operation Christmas Child is being flooded by more shoe box gifts than there are recipients. Many items are just given away to worker. Therefore, we should give careful consideration to finding a different project to support this year.

The next meeting will be held on Sept 10, at 1:30 pm. Marcia made a motion that was seconded by Gloria to adjourn the meeting. Meeting adjourned.

Moe made a motion and it was seconded by Kelly to approve the Pastor's report. Motion carried.

PROPERTY & MANAGEMENT: Zem's completed cleaning the chairs and the carpets in the main areas of the church. We will have them return to do the Sunday school rooms and the Den. Moe made a motion to accept the proposal from John Gallagher to fix the cracks and strip

the parking lot. Adam seconded the motion and the motion carried. The weeds have been sprayed on the additional land. Tim will check into planting grass or hay on that land. Tim will check on cleaning the ice machine. Kelly made a motion, and it was seconded by Laurie to approve the Property and Management report. Motion carried.

WORSHIP & EVANGELISM & Youth & Education:

Water was distributed during the food give away July 10th and the facilities were open for anyone to use. The next give away is scheduled for September 11th. The Education Committee met July 7th. There was discussion on Sunday School and any changes that should be made for this fall. It was suggested that we divide the students into preschool, elementary, middle school and high school. These will be decided based on the curriculum chosen for the fall. A yearly calendar with suggested activities for all ages was drawn up. The group felt that they would need to recruit help to implement the various activities. There was discussion on how to promote the church and activities on Facebook and other media. The idea of having a float/truck that is available to go to various area parades and events was discussed. Moe made a motion to approve the purchase of signage to be used for parades etc. The motion was seconded by Tim and the motion carried. Kelly made a motion to approve the Worship and Evangelism and the Youth and Education reports. It was seconded by Tim. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS: Moe made a motion to pay the architect bill and it was seconded by Adam. Motion carried. The Building Committee received the conceptual drawing and will seek more input on needed areas. Brian Sandvig will conduct the annual audit of the church finances. Pastor Simonson and his wife will visit July 19-22. The Call Committee will work on an itinerary.
