Go Jacks! on Josh Keeton Kim and Marlene Gustafson wish to personally thank the members of Living Word for their generous gift toward the building of Echo Farm International in Uganda, Africa. With the gift of \$2000 from our Impact Fund and donations of \$1288.92 from May's Noisy Change, the Restore International Uganda Team has watched God open doors and bring into existence many things that did not exist a few months ago.

Earlier this year when an agronomist from Uganda's government visited the village, he asked about the accomplishments of the mission team toward their vision of creating a farm on which to grow vegetables and fruit on a one and a half acre of rich soil. The team's plan began with the digging of a well and they had placed a sign with their motto at the entrance stating, "Your water, Your Life!" The agronomist asked about it and the team leader's answer was "We want

people to come for water they need from the well or spiritual water of Jesus." The leader was impressed with the walls of the well which young men had dug and stated that he wanted to learn from them saying, "We stand with you!"

With his next visit, he brought the team an offer, a special government grant which would provide 75% of the cost of a solar system to power the well, the building of a homemade brick building to house a small office and room for storage, tools, and vegetables for marketing. And so, the team was in need of six thousand dollars or their 25%. More than one half was attained with the help the team received from Living Word. At this time the project has been completed. As a congregation, we can thank God for leading us to being part of His work in a small village in Africa!



### **IMPACT MISSIONS**









On Saturday our US team joined with our ALWM Vital Links medical team of volunteers sponsoring a major medical evangelism outreach at Khanh Vinh Church, in Khanh Vinh Province! We arrived at 8 am to a parking lot that was rapidly filling with motorbikes, and many people ready for their doctor visits and the other things brought by our US team. This ALWM partner church is one of the two largest Protestant Churches in Vietnam, with 8000 members! They are also the mother church of many congregations planted throughout the province. Our ALWM Vietnamese team that day included 35 volunteer doctors, pharmacists and nurses. There were approximately 50 volunteers from the host church, plus 6 on our US team. So about 90 volunteers served 475 people from the surrounding villages up to 20 + miles away!

The medical team did health exams for everyone, with prescriptions and meds for anyone who was sick. Medical care is in very limited supply for the poor villagers and church members, and the pastor said this is their best outreach every year. Our US team added crafts, sports, toothbrushes and toothpaste for all, plus reading glasses were matched

to over 225 people including sand seen glass cases from friends in the US. Vietnam is about 2% evangelical and another 8% that the Joshua Project identifies as Christian adherents, linked to the Catholic Churches planted during French colonial occupation.

Our local bus driver said as the day unfolded, "this is great and many of the people are very happy!" In addition to the 475 adults, we had another 100 children take part in the crafts, sports and games, as well as the toothbrush demonstration by the volunteer dentist. We also came with floss for everyone, which Van, our project manager said the kids in the village had never seen before! It was a long warm day, and everyone was tired and grateful for all that happened. It was a memorable day, another example of how ALWM Int'l does effective ministry with gifted and called ministries and partners.

Sunday, we worshipped with a local Vietnamese congregation, followed by visits to several churches where we have installed water filtration systems over the past year.
